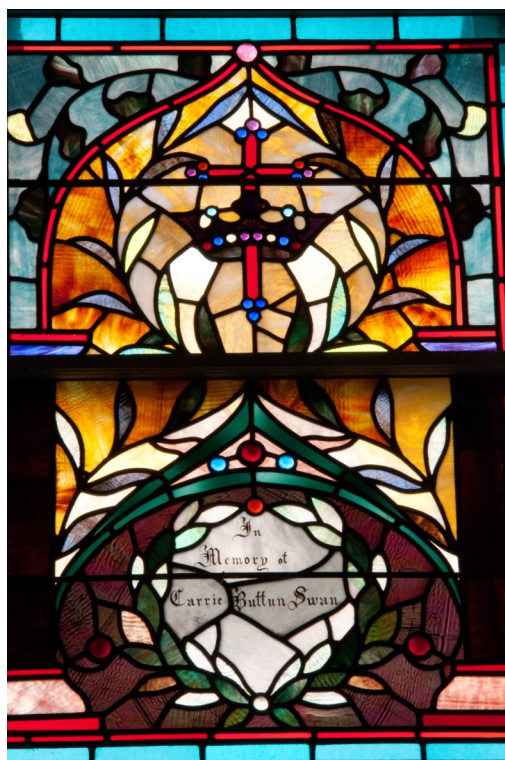

Requests for Checks: If you need our church treasurer to cut you a check, either to reimburse you for money you have fronted for a church project, or to pay a church vendor, you must now fill out a check request form. Return the completed form to the “In” box on the office door or give it directly to the church treasurer. This will help us to keep our accounting straight.

Winter Foods for the Give and Take Blessing Nook: As the weather cools in the evening, hungry people need heartier foods. Canned pastas, hearty soups, and baked beans or chili beans are needed. We have a steady need for canned meats and fish, peanut butter, cereal, and canned fruit. Please, **no** vegetables, plain beans, or rice. We have an abundance of these right now due to some generous donations. As always, thank you to all who donate in these lean times. It makes a real difference in the lives of our neighbors.

Recycling: Many folks seem to be unaware that our church does recycling. If you have # 1 or #2 plastic containers or metal food cans left over from a church activity, please rinse them out and deposit them in one of the beige boxes underneath the big dishwashing sinks. Paper or cardboard, such as your church bulletin, can be placed in the big box just inside the church door next to the food donation box. A blue recycling bin is coming soon to that location to make the paper recycling center more obvious. Thanks for "pitching in" to help our environment.

Communion Sunday Help Needed: Over the past several years, various lay people have taken turns preparing the Communion elements and assisting in serving Communion. Mitty Johnson has been volunteering to do this over the past several years and is ready to have someone else take a turn. She will be happy to continue to supply the grape juice each month, so the new volunteer will just have to buy the bread and cut it up, prepare the table, serve the elements, and wash the few Communion vessels afterwards. Do you or a loved one need prayer? Our church members are always happy to pray for your needs. We have three ways to request prayer for your situation:

For urgent or confidential needs you can call Mitty Johnson (new phone number 603-242-5597) or any member of our prayer chain.

To ask the whole church to pray and to lift up your concern during worship you can call or email the church office or Outreach Team leader Mitty Johnson. You may do this in addition to having your concern on the prayer chain, if you wish.

To be added to the church prayer list or to have someone phone you for private prayer you may fill out a form and leave it in the "Prayer Request" box to the right of the church entrance door.

We will pray for anyone so if your friend or neighbor expresses a concern to you, ask, "Would you like to have your concern on the church prayer list?" If someone is worried about confidentiality, they may use the prayer chain or be put on the church list with first name only.

Communion Offerings: One of the things that fell by the wayside during the Covid shutdown was our monthly Communion offering for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund which helps people with temporary needs such as fuel oil. The Leadership Team would like to revive this monthly offering, but expand it to include other missions that serve local people or those farther afield. Under the name Monthly Mission, we will collect for the Discretionary Fund on Communion Sunday in odd-numbered months and another mission on Communion Sunday in even-numbered months. We will do this for several months on a trial basis, and would like to hear feedback from the congregation. All of the designated missions are ones that TUCW has supported in the past. 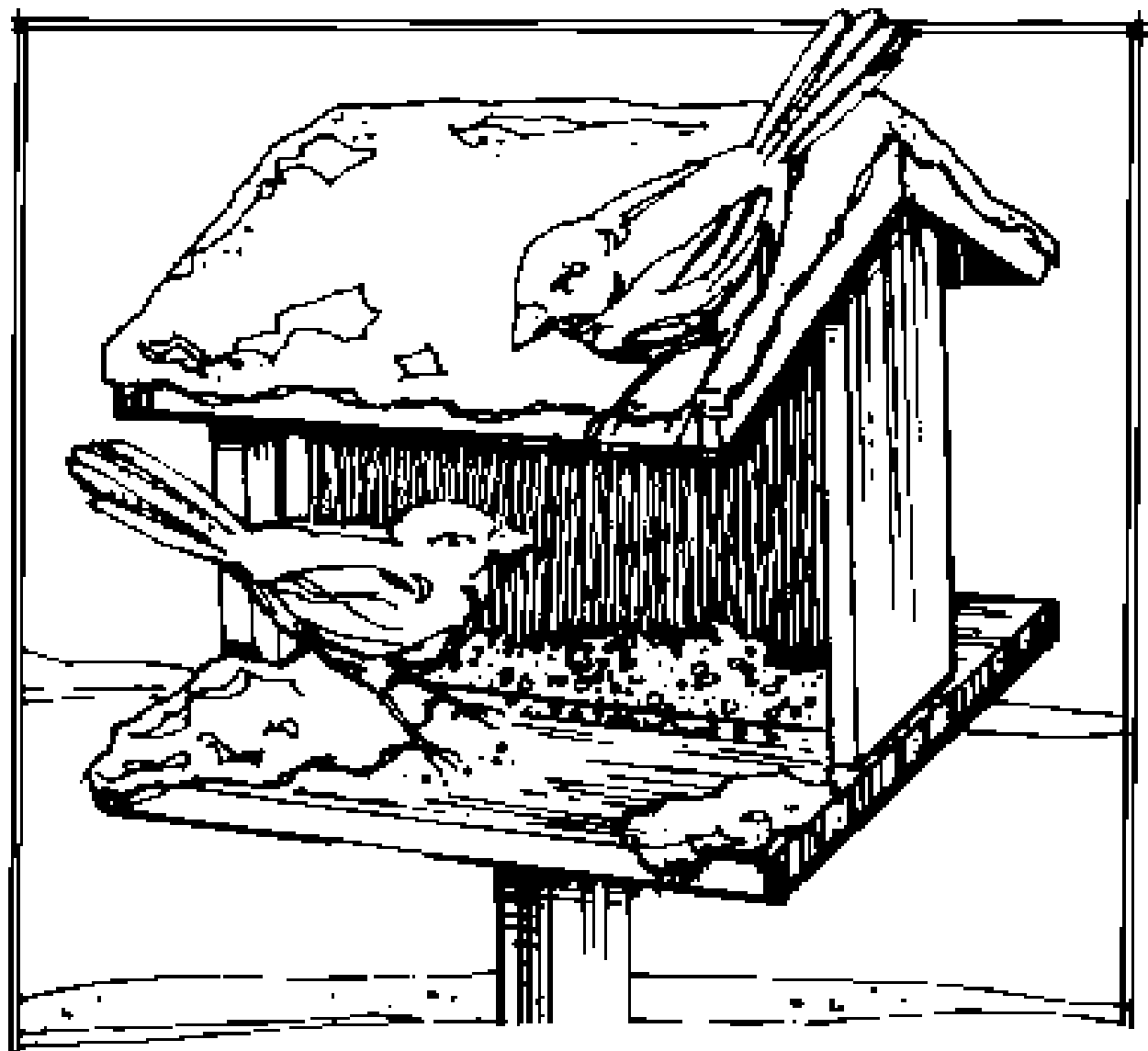

Mary Elizabeth (Frost) Johnson, 97, a lifelong resident of Winchester, passed away peacefully on Sunday, February 9, 2025, at her home of over 74 years. She was surrounded by the love of her family.

She was born the eldest daughter of Madelene (Handy) and Forest Appleton Frost on October 29, 1927, in Winchester. She was educated locally and graduated (saludatorian) from Thayer High School class of 1945.

On August 26, 1950, Mary exchanged vows with the love of her life, Stephen Prentice Johnson. They were married in The Center Church, (the “brick” church in the center of Winchester) and were happily married for over 63 years. Stephen passed away on February 5, 2014, 11 years and 4 days before Mary.

Music was her life and everything centered around it. Mary was fortunate to have been blessed with perfect pitch. She graduated from Boston University with a degree in Music Education, honing her skills in piano, organ and cello. She then taught at a Laconia, NH school for a year. She was the Music Director at The Federated Church of Winchester, now The United Church of Winchester, for many (45+) years. playing the organ, leading the Senior and Youth choirs, and directing other musical groups. She had sung in the Keene Chorale and participated in many area music opportunities, including the Keene and Brattleboro American Legion Bands.

One of her fondest memories is, as a young adult home from college for the summer, along with her sisters, hosting a live radio broadcast of music on Sunday mornings. It was 15 minutes on a Keene station (WKNE) and was a very joyous and wonderful experience for them!

Mary enjoyed her time working for the town of Winchester in many capacities. Starting as Deputy Tax Collector for 15 years, then 14 years as the Tax Collector and as Supervisor of the Check List; she served the town for over 60 years!

Along with working, Mary loved being a member of many different organizations. She was involved in the Kings Daughter’s and Son’s, the Winchester Women’s Club, Winchester Community band, and the Keene Community Orchestra. She was also a proud member of the United Church of Winchester and had served as their treasurer for many years. She will be fondly remembered by many patrons for serving them at the church monthly Bean Suppers.

In retirement, she volunteered numerous hours as accompanist for the school music program, helped with the marching band at Memorial Day parades, and playing piano for the residents at Applewood once to twice a week. Mary was also an avid handbell ringer with many groups. She also knitted many hats and mittens for anyone who needed them. An amazing seamstress, she was always making something! She also tatted and crocheted. Jigsaw puzzles were a passion and she had hundreds of them!

Mrs. Johnson is survived by her daughters, Martha Johnson of Spain, Miriam Johnson of Winchester, and Elizabeth Johnson of Hillsborough. She is also survived by her 5 grandchildren, 10 great grandchildren, and her great great grandson, a Sister in law, and a Brother in Law. Mary had a large family that also included step grandchildren and step great grandchildren, neices, nephews, many extended family, and so many dear friends.

She was predeceased by her parents, her husband, and her two sisters, Ruth Fairburn and Caroline Polk; her sister in law, Margaret, two Sons in Law and Grace Jane, a great granddaughter.

In keeping with Mary’s wishes, a celebration of life service will be held at The United Church of Winchester on March 22, 2025 at 4 pm. Refreshments and time as “family and friends” will follow, to be held in the Fellowship Hall at the church.
