CHURCH DONATION:

In September of 2023 there was an anonymous cash donation of \$3000.00 with a designation of "garbage disposal". At that time there was some conversation about whether or not the kitchen sink, or more commonly known as "Sandy's Sink", was experiencing some issues with clogging and overflowing. Conversation ensued about remedies, one of which was a garbage disposal.

However, once it was discovered that garbage disposals were not permitted in kitchens such as ours, the conversation turned to "reconfiguration" of the sink and eliminating the air gap below the sink. That kitchen is designed with an air gap to meet the NH State plumbing codes for commercial kitchens. Our maintenance team has developed procedures for routinely inspecting and cleaning the catch below the sink to ensure the sink doesn't overflow. Additionally, they have resurfaced the interior of that cabinet with protective materials that will reduce the amount of wear and tear in the event of future overflows. If you have noticed, please peek at it the next time you're in the kitchen! Maintenance has solved an issue that left the Treasurer with an issue, \$3000 dollars without a home. At a recent leadership meeting, the maintenance committee presented estimates for the replacement of a damaged storm window that protects our beautiful stained-glass window. Estimates are between \$3000 and \$5000, however, we anticipate that expenditure to be more when an inspection is made on the remaining storm windows. The Leadership Team would like to use the \$3000 anonymous donation toward that repair.

If anyone has any questions or concern, please direct them via email to a leadership member for discussion.



Communion Offerings: One of the things that fell by the wayside during the Covid shutdown was our monthly Communion offering for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund which helps people with temporary needs such as fuel oil. The Leadership Team would like to revive this monthly offering, but expand it to include other missions that serve local people or those farther afield. Under the name Monthly Mission, we will collect for the Discretionary Fund on Communion Sunday in odd-numbered months and another mission on Communion Sunday in even-numbered months. We will do this for several months on a trial basis, and would like to hear feedback from the congregation. All of the designated missions are ones that TUCW has supported in the past.
